1. On 23 NOV, the West Point's Ethics Debate Team will compete in the 2019 Northeast Regional Ethics Bowl at Salisbury University. The team will compete against 24 other colleges and universities from across the Northeast. The top four teams will qualify for the National Ethics Bowl in February.

1. 2 December. **Ms. Jen Easterly**, a Managing Director at Morgan Stanley and Global Head of the Firm's Cybersecurity Fusion Center, will guest lecture with SS464: Homeland Security and Defense on "Safeguarding and Securing Cyberspace." Prior to her time with Morgan Stanley, she served nearly three decades in service to the U.S. Government, including time on the National Security Council as Special Assistant to President Obama and Senior Director for Counterterrorism and an over twenty year career in the Army that included standing up the Army's first cyber battalion.
